



VIEWS FROM MARY'S TREE HOUSE



Mary Pope Osborne,

Merlin Missions

Q: When did you first start writing the Magic Tree House series, and how many books are there today?

A: I began the series 26 years ago, and today there are over 100 Magic Tree House books, counting all the fiction and the nonfiction Fact Trackers books.

Q: Do you have a favorite book, and if so, which one is it?

A: My World War II book meant the most to me: *World at War, 1944*. It's the longest and most advanced book in the series, and to me, the most exciting.

Q: How did you choose the topic for your new book, *Warriors in Winter*?

A: I've always wanted to write about an ancient Roman warrior camp. Roman warriors were considered some of the bravest, strongest, and best-trained warriors of all time.

Q: Which Fact Tracker did you find most interesting to research?

A: I think the most interesting research may have been for an upcoming book on Benjamin Franklin. I thought I knew a lot about him, but there was so much I didn't know—all the years he spent in Paris and London, the languages he taught himself, his inventions! I was in complete awe of this brilliant man.

Q: Have you ever traveled to do research for a Fact Tracker, and if so, where was the most exciting place you traveled?

A: I haven't traveled a lot just to do research, but having lived in many places has helped my writing. Writing *Leprechauns and Irish Folklore* was easier because I lived in Ireland. My firsthand knowledge of the Revolutionary War came from having lived near the Yorktown battleground. When I wrote about tsunamis I remembered that they tested the tsunami warning sirens when we lived on the beach in Hawaii.


Q: What is your favorite winter activity?

A: I love to hear our old house creak and groan in a snowstorm. A good fire in the fireplace, people you can laugh with on a cold winter night, a lovely stew, and reading a great book are my idea of heaven during long winters in the Berkshire Hills.

AROUND THE WORLD WITH JACK AND ANNIE!

THE ARCTIC

In *Polar Bears Past Bedtime*, Jack and Annie are whisked away to the frozen Arctic where they meet a seal hunter, Siberian huskies, and a giant polar bear! When they meet their new seal hunter friend, they learn that he “wears sealskin clothing to protect him from icy winds” (13). Seal hunters often live in igloos, which “means ‘house’ in the language of the native Arctic people. The house is built with . . . dry snow [which] is good wall material because it keeps in the heat. The temperature inside an igloo can be 65 degrees warmer than the temperature outside” (26).



Can you imagine living in an igloo? You would have to cook, sleep, and play all in one small room with the rest of your family. And forget having a TV! Kids in the Arctic would have fun by playing games like Kneel Jump, where they kneel on the floor, then jump forward on their knees. Try that with your friends! If you were in the Arctic, you would also be able to see the Northern Lights. “The swirl of light is caused by electrically charged particles from the sun striking atoms and molecules in the earth’s atmosphere” (50). What colors do you see in this Northern Lights picture?

HOMETOWN HEROES





We recently caught up with **Mary Pope Osborne**, author of *Magic Tree House* and *Merlin Missions*, and **Natalie Pope Boyce**, author of the *Magic Tree House Fact Trackers*, and asked them a few questions!

What are some of your favorite things to do when the weather warms up?

Mary: I love to walk early in the morning and late in the afternoon. I love watching leaves and flowers return. I love rolling down all my car windows and riding on country roads with my dogs sticking their heads out the windows. I just *love* spring and summer!

How do you cope with spring fever?

Natalie: In New England where Mary and I live there isn't much of a spring until the end of May. To be honest, I don't cope very well with spring fever and sometimes, believe it or not, I get very cranky that summer hasn't appeared yet.

What continues to spark your interest in learning new things?

Natalie: When you begin to learn new things, you realize how many more exciting new things there are still to learn.

Also many of the things I thought I knew, I really didn't. For example, do you think polar bears have white fur? Actually they don't! Do some research to find out why and impress all your friends!

What new adventures are in store for Jack and Annie?

Mary: Jack and Annie will travel back in time to Philadelphia, where they meet Benjamin Franklin and take him into the future to present-day Frog Creek, Pennsylvania.

AROUND THE WORLD WITH JACK AND ANNIE!

THE OCEAN

In *Dolphins at Daybreak*, Jack and Annie travel to a coral reef in the middle of the ocean! They learn that coral reefs are made up of skeletons of dead corals—tiny sea animals. Jack and Annie explore the ocean in a small diving vessel called a submersible and swim next to starfish, pink jellyfish, a blue sea horse, a giant clam, and many more colorful ocean creatures! When Jack and Annie find themselves next to an octopus, they learn that they are gentle, shy creatures with huge strength, and it is nearly impossible to free an object from the grasp of their tentacles! Have you ever seen an octopus?

Can you imagine being an oceanographer, which is what we call scientists who study the ocean? Sometimes they dive super deep in their submersibles to gather information about the ocean floor. Oceanographers are able to look at and study so many beautiful sea creatures like fish, dolphins, and oysters but also have to be careful and respect these animals. Just remember, if you see a shark in the water, don't splash!



We recently caught up with **Mary Pope Osborne**, author of *Magic Tree House* and *Merlin Missions*, and **Natalie Pope Boyce**, author of the *Magic Tree House Fact Trackers*, and asked them a few questions!

Ben Franklin was an American hero. What other heroes have inspired you?

Mary: Different heroes I've written about are actually the heroes who inspire me the most: George Washington, Abraham Lincoln, Florence Nightingale, Clara Barton, and Jackie Robinson.

Are there any present-day heroes who continue to inspire you?

Natalie: I think my present-day heroes probably don't have fame or a lot of money. They are the people like doctors, nurses, and aid workers who risk their lives to help others.

What have been some of Jack and Annie's favorite animal adventures?

Mary: Jack and Annie LOVE dogs. Dogs appear in a number of the stories, including *Dogs in the Dead of Night* and *Balto of the Blue Dawn*. I would like to have dogs appear in more books, because just like Jack and Annie, I LOVE dogs.

What about Ben Franklin's life blew you away while you were researching him for the newest Fact Tracker?

Natalie: Ben Franklin was a much bigger genius than I had thought. He was a famous scientist, inventor, and writer, and was the only person to sign all four major documents of the Revolution. And he did all of this with only two years of school!

A new deluxe edition of *Christmas in Camelot* will be out in time for the holidays. Will there be more holiday-themed adventures for Jack and Annie?

Mary: Yes, I hope so! The new deluxe edition coming out this fall is really exciting, and we have more planned for the future!



AROUND THE WORLD WITH JACK AND ANNIE!

PHILADELPHIA

In *To the Future, Ben Franklin!*, Jack and Annie are whisked away to Old Philadelphia in 1787, where they meet Benjamin Franklin! When they adventure to find "Doctor Ben," they're told by a gardener that he is "one of the smartest human beings of all time" and that "he once stole thunderbolts right out of the clouds" (p.15). Jack and Annie quickly understand why people love Benjamin Franklin so much: "He's an inventor and a scientist! A diplomat and a writer! A scholar and a businessman" (p.15)! But they have a mission: convince Ben Franklin to sign the Constitution. With the help of their book about Old Philadelphia, Jack and Annie whisk Ben away to the future to show him the ways of their present-day world and how none of it would be possible if he and other delegates had not signed the Constitution!



What do you think it would be like to come face to face with cars, power lines, computers, air-conditioning, and planes for the first time? Imagine being an adult who has never seen or used a phone before!

Can you think of other inventions that would startle someone from the past? Ben Franklin is stunned by modern inventions, but Jack and Annie know they have to convince him that his actions helped lead to these very successes. 



Because of all the work he did for the colonies and the United States, Ben is sometimes called the **FIRST AMERICAN**.

During a big thunderstorm, in 1752, Ben and his son William stood outside in the rain with a kite, a metal rod, and a metal key. An electrical charge from the storm clouds traveled down the rod and into the key, and thanks to this experiment, the world found out that lightning is a type of electricity.



On April 15, 1947, **JACKIE ROBINSON** became one of the first black players on a Major League team. Although fans, players, and even some of his own teammates threatened and physically abused him, Jackie never lost his temper. Jackie went on to win the first Rookie of the Year Award for being the best new MLB player.



We recently caught up with **Mary Pope Osborne**, author of *Magic Tree House* and *Merlin Missions*, and **Natalie Pope Boyce**, author of the *Magic Tree House Fact Trackers*, and asked them a few questions!

Have any ideas in published *Magic Tree House* books come from kids?

Mary: Absolutely! Whenever I speak to readers, I ask them to share their ideas with me—or I have them vote on ideas that I'm thinking about. Kids have not only helped me decide where Jack and Annie should go but they've helped by voting on different titles that I'm considering.

Why do you think kids like narwhals so much?

Natalie: Because they are such unique creatures! Their tusks are reminiscent of unicorns, which are very popular with kids of all ages. You don't expect an aquatic animal to have a unicorn horn!

What is your favorite part about the *Magic Tree House* stage show tour?

Mary: There are many different *Magic Tree House* musicals being done around the country right now. One of my favorite moments is at the end of *Showtime with Shakespeare*, when the whole cast sings a song called "Thy Life Is a Miracle."

Out of all of the *Fact Trackers* you've written, which was the hardest to write, and why?

Natalie: The hardest *Fact Trackers* to write have been those that encompassed centuries of history. Several thousand years of Roman, Chinese, Japanese, or Viking history are hard to condense!

Does your dog Captain Wilson like the snow? Does he have a winter wardrobe?

Mary: This will be Captain's first winter in the north. He has short hair and is quite skinny, so he definitely needs a little coat. In fact, he has three coats. The Captain loves adventure, so yes, he enjoys the snow.



ARCTIC CIRCLE

In *Narwhal on a Sunny Night*, Jack and Annie are whisked away to Greenland, the world's largest island! Although you would think Greenland is green, it's actually covered in ice, and is partly located in the Arctic Circle, along with Alaska, Iceland, Scandinavia, Canada, and Russia. The Arctic Circle is one of the coldest regions in the world. On their adventure, Jack and Annie learn about icebergs, the Inuit people who live in Greenland, and different Arctic animals, like seals, walrus, reindeer, and a variety of whales—including narwhals! Jack and Annie meet a seafarer who helps them save a narwhal. They realize they've traveled to Greenland in the time of Vikings, and are with Leif Erikson—"the first European to step onto the North American continent . . . five hundred years before Christopher Columbus." (p. 54) Thanks to Jack and Annie's



book about Greenland, they know that narwhals can stay underwater for twenty-five minutes and communicate by using a variety of sounds. What else do Jack and Annie learn from Leif and the narwhal?
